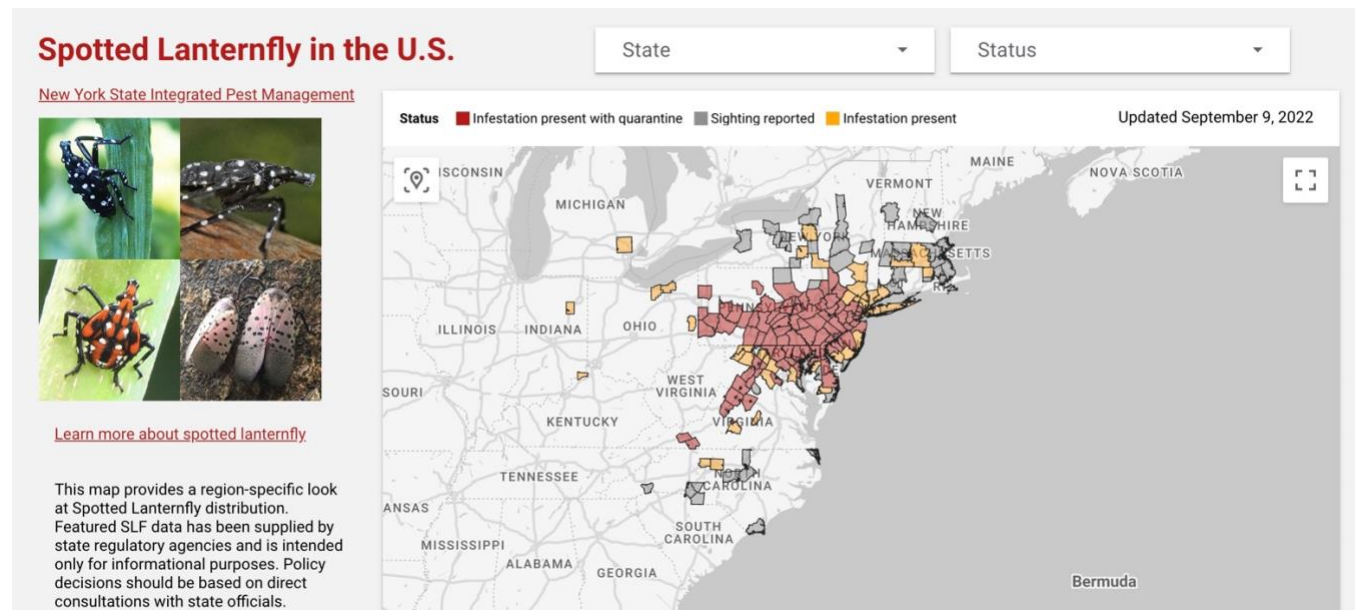


SLF Quarantine and Management Recommendations by State

Pennsylvania

Advice: Kill it! Smash it...just get rid of it!

Reporting: If you see a SLF, it's imperative to immediately [report it online](#) or via phone by calling 1-888-4BADFLY, especially if you are outside the quarantine zone.

Quarantine: An SLF permit is required for all businesses, agencies and organizations, agricultural and non-agricultural, working within the quarantine, which move regulated articles, such as products, vehicles and other conveyances, within or from the quarantine.

New York State

Advice: Identify it, squish it and report it

Quarantine: None yet, but it may be coming. The state has an exterior quarantine in place, which restricts the movement of goods brought into New York from other infested states. It requires regulated articles, such as packing materials, landscaping and construction equipment and nursery stock to have certificates of inspection issued from the impacted states.

New Jersey

Advice: Trap and report it; remove tree-of-heaven.

Quarantine: The New Jersey Department of Agriculture (NJDA) issued a quarantine for counties where SLF has been confirmed. This quarantine requires all businesses and organizations moving within or from the quarantine zone in the course of their work to obtain permits issued by NJDA.

Currently quarantined counties include: Burlington, Camden, Essex, Gloucester, Hunterdon, Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth, Morris, Salem, Somerset, Union and Warren counties.

Maryland

Advice: Snap it, catch it, freeze it and report it.

Quarantine: Restrictions have been placed on Harford and Cecil counties.

Massachusetts

Advice: Learn to identify it and report it.

Quarantine: None yet. The insects arrived in the state on materials shipped from Pennsylvania counties that are under a "spotted lanternfly quarantine." The Massachusetts Department of Agricultural Resources said nursery stock with lanternflies and their eggs "may have been unintentionally imported and planted in several parts" of the state.
